### 24 hour Bird Race 2015



## Trip Reports

### Snettisham RSPB & Coastal Path - 14th February 2015 - GT

This was our first visit to Snettisham since 2011 and in between time the 4 viewing hides had been destroyed by winter storms but 2 had been repaired/replaced. We headed off to the hides and on the way had good numbers of waders including, Curlew, Godwits, Dunlin, Redshank, large flocks of both Golden Plover and Oystercatchers as well as Grey Plover, Sanderling, Ringed Plover & Lapwing over the Wash mudflats. Looking over the pools from the hides we had good views of an obliging Black Necked Grebe. After lunch we walked to the coastal path so we had views inland over the fields and pools. We soon found the Pink Footed Geese - there were large numbers, probably several thousand noisily feeding on the stubble and beet feeds. As we watched a Barn Owl was also quartering the ground in front of us and was having some success finding food in the shape of small voles/mice. We had a total of 67 species on the day.

### WT Christopher Cadbury Reserve, Upton Warren, – 14<sup>th</sup> March 2015 - GT

It was an overcast day but a northerly breeze had been in place for a few days and as well as keeping the temperature down it did reduce the possibility of early spring migrants to this inland site. So it proved as we didn't see any migrants although there were signs of breeding activity throughout the day. The Great Crested Grebe were starting their mirroring courtship display and at least 28 Avocet were present looking to claim a breeding area amongst the numerous Black Headed Gulls. There were also 4 Little Egret at the Moors Pool and 9 Curlew and 4 Snipe. A total of 50 species on the day.

### RSPB Nagshead, Gloucs – 25th April 2015 - GT

This was the Group's first visit to this site situated deep in the Forest of Dean. We set off in two groups to walk the 2.25 mile through the oak woodlands and back over the heath. The woods were full of resident birds in full voice which was interspersed with warbler song from Blackcap, Willow Warbler and Chiffchaff. One group were lucky enough to see a pair of Lesser Spotted Woodpeckers on a fallen tree and then up into the top of the tree canopy before flying off - an excellent start to the day. Soon after we were watching pairs of Pied Flycatchers interacting and visiting likely nest box sites. On the way back some of us had just been looking at another pair of Pied Flycatchers when Marion shouted "Hawfinch" a few yards ahead of us down the path. We eagerly fell in behind her and in a small patch of water in the dip was a bathing Hawfinch - splendidly caught in the sunlight. It lingered briefly but we managed to relocate it a few minutes later preening on a tree branch offering further views for the lucky few. In the afternoon we went to the lower hide and had good views of a pair of Mandarin and a return walk into the forest produced a singing Wood Warbler. 51 species on the day with some much sought after ticks too!

Picturesque woodland reserve which, at this time of year, should be alive with warbler song. Pied and Spotted Flycatcher and Redstart breed here.  
Toilets but no café. Cost £2.50 RSPB permit required.

July/August

NNR Gibraltar Point. Lincs PE24 4SU

We were looking for Springtime migrant species on our last visit here. An Autumn trip should throw up migrators heading in the opposite direction.  
No café (being rebuilt after storm damage, but a mobile catering van should be on site) but there are facilities .

October 17th

RSPB Titchwell Marsh, Norfolk, PE31 8BB

We can't go wrong with this wonderful reserve on the north Norfolk coast.  
Café and facilities.  
Cost £2.50

November 14th

RSPB Ouse Washes, Cambs, PE15 0NF

The waterfowl numbers should be swelling with more migrants flying south at this time of year. Hen Harriers, Short-eared Owls, Peregrines and Merlins hunt over the washes and surrounding farmland.  
No café but there are facilities  
Cost £2.50.

December 12th

WLT Brandon Marsh, Warks, CV8 3ET

A nearby reserve where we can make the most of the short winter days. Bitterns show themselves periodically. Always good numbers of waders and waterfowl found on the lagoons.  
Café (if you plan to have a meal in the café, they would like advance notice to help their caterers) and facilities  
Cost £5.00 (unless you are a WLT member then the cost is £2.50 and your membership card will be required on the day).
